

CANDEMONIUM 2019 OFFICIAL RULES

The CANDEMONIUM 2019 competition is a creative way to help the clients of Harvest of Hope Pantry in Boulder, CO, and Sister Carmen Community Center in Lafayette, CO, obtain much needed supplemental food. This food structure building competition will run from August 1, 2019, through September 30, 2019.

PRIZES

"Best in Show" Award for Most Impressive Structure

The organization that creates the most impressive sculpture will go on a \$1,000 shopping spree at Grandrabbit's Toy Shoppe to purchase toys for the 2018 "Share-A-Gift" Holiday Toy Drive benefiting children of low-income families in the BVSD area. The most impressive sculpture winner will also receive the CANDEMONIUM Cup Trophy (AKA "Candy") which they may keep possession of until a new CANDEMONIUM competition winner is announced next year.

"Heavy Lifter" Award

One Qdoba Hot Taco Bar for 15 will be awarded to the organization who donates the most non-perishable food BY WEIGHT during the competition.

The CANDEMONIUM 2019 competition will run from August 1, 2019 through September 30, 2019. Photo entry submissions may be submitted at Candemonium.org at any time during this period. Submission period officially ends September 30, 2019, at 11:59 PM (Mountain).

Judging of the Most Impressive Sculpture will be done on or around October 10, 2019. Judging panel will consist of a representative from Sister Carmen, Harvest of Hope, and an as-yet-to-be-determined member of the community.

The three "Best in Show" winners will be notified and announced on or around October 14, 2019.

The "Heavy Lifter" prize will be awarded once all cans are collected and weighed, likely by October 30, 2019.

COMPETITION RULES

The CANDEMONIUM 2019 competition is open to all Boulder Valley organizations willing to donate their canned food goods at the end of the competition. Canned food goods will be split equally between to Harvest of Hope Pantry in Boulder, CO, and Sister Carmen Center in Lafayette, CO — two of Boulder County's leading nonprofits serving those in need of supplemental food. Competing organizations will build a structure made of canned food goods. This can be done at their place of business or any other Boulder Valley location of their choice. **To enter the competition, competitors must submit a photo of their "can art" at Candemonium.org.**

All teams are responsible for acquiring and/or purchasing all food used in their structure. Tax receipts from Harvest of Hope and/or Sister Carmen Center may be issued upon submission of receipts and donor information. Non-food costs are not eligible for tax receipts.

Structures must be made solely of unopened canned food goods with all original labels intact. No alcohol, glass containers, pet food, junk food, expired or open packages of food may be used in the structure or donated.

Cans of food may be joined using any of the following methods: Clear packaging tape, double sided tape, rubber bands, and wire. Any method that provides easy disassembly of the structure is permitted provided the label and cans are NOT damaged. No gluing, welding or other permanent methods of connecting cans is allowed. Structures must be completely self-supporting.

Building of the structure may begin any time after August 1, 2019 and must be completed by September 30, 2019. A photo of the completed structure must be submitted online at Candemonium.org by 11:59 PM on September 30, 2019, to be eligible for prizes.

Donations are not limited to canned items only! Any non-perishable foods are welcome, but our food pantries are in particular need of:

- Peanut Butter
- Canned Fruit (low or no sugar added)
- Hot & Cold Cereals
- Pasta Varieties & Sauce
- Hearty Soups and Stews
- Canned Tuna & Salmon
- Canned Corn
- Refried & Pinto Beans

A vehicle from Harvest of Hope Pantry or Sister Carmen Center will pick up the cans at your location between October 10, 2019 and October 20, 2019.

CANDEMONIUM 2019 participants agree to be solely responsible for any injuries or damage that may occur during construction, display and deconstruction of the can art. Harvest of Hope Pantry and Sister Carmen Center encourage all competitors to work in the safest manner possible.
