

CORPORATE PARTNERSHIPS

Harvest of Hope Pantry seeks to provide a sense of hope to Boulder families and individuals by relieving the stress of food insecurity.

After decades of running separate food assistance programs, St. Thomas Aquinas and Sacred Heart of Jesus parishes were seeing continuing increases in the number of people seeking food aid. With the help of feedback from partners like Community Food Share, Boulder Shelter for the Homeless, and Emergency Family Assistance Association, they determined that no local organization had the capacity to serve everyone experiencing food insecurity in Boulder. So in 2012, they joined forces to form an independent nonprofit organization to meet that need. Since then, Harvest of Hope Pantry has continued to grow steadily and is now the only food pantry in Boulder serving everyone who comes to our door.

The pantry offers two types of programs, in order to meet the particular needs of anyone experiencing food insecurity

- » A weekly program for people with kitchens - families and individuals with the means to store and prepare food.
- » A daily program for people without kitchens - mostly people experiencing homelessness.

The pantry provides healthy, supplemental food to Boulder residents in a grocery-like shopping experience where participants select their preferred foods. We help relieve the burden and stress of food insecurity by allowing clients the opportunity to redirect scarce funds toward paying their bills, rather than having to spend money on food. The pantry also helps to minimize food waste in our community by providing an efficient outlet for the redistribution of good food that would otherwise be thrown out.
